4	(a) Establishment.—		
5	(1) IN GENERAL.—The Administrator shall es-		
6	tablish and support a commission—		
7	(A) to assess the weather forecasts and		
8	forecast products provided by the National Oce-		
9	anic and Atmospheric Administration; and		
10	(B) to provide advice to the Federal Gov-		
11	ernment, including Congress, on matters relat-		
12	ing to the highest priority weather foregast

4	(2) Designation.—The commission estab-
5	lished under paragraph (1) shall be known as the
6	"Weather Commission".
7	(3) Interaction with federal agencies
8	AND DEPARTMENTS.—
9	(A) SECURING INFORMATION.—In carrying
10	out its functions under this section, the Weath-
11	er Commission may secure directly from any
12	Federal agency or department any information
13	it considers necessary to carry out its functions
14	under this Act.
15	(B) COOPERATION.—Each such agency or
16	department is authorized to cooperate with the
17	Weather Commission and, to the extent other-
18	wise permitted by law, to furnish such informa-
19	tion (other than information described in sec-
20	tion 552(b)(1)(A) of title 5, United States
21	Code) to the Weather Commission, upon the re-
22	quest of the Weather Commission.

24	(1) Composition.—

1	(A) IN GENERAL.—The Weather Commis-
2	sion shall be composed of individuals appointed
3	Administrator of the National Oceanic and by the President from among leading experts Atmospheric
4	and innovators from each relevant stakeholder Administration
5	group described in clauses (i) through (vii) of
6	subparagraph (B).
7	(B) Number.—The Weather Commission
8	shall be composed of no fewer than 16 mem-
9	bers, including—
10	(i) 2 representatives from State emer-
11	gency management agencies;
12	(ii) 2 representatives from State agri-
13	culture agencies;
14	(iii) 1 representative from the Native
15	American, Alaskan Native, or Native Ha-
16	waiian community;
17	(iv) 2 representatives from the private
18	aerospace industry;
19	(v) 2 representatives from the oper-
20	ational forecasting community;
21	(vi) 2 representatives from the aca-
22	demic community; and
23	(vii) 1 representative from a profes-
24	sional society that focuses on meteorology

12	(2) CHAIR.—The Weather Commission shall se-
13	lect a chairperson from among its members.
14	(c) DUTIES.—The duties of the Weather Commission
15	are as follows:
16	(1) To assess the weather forecasts and fore-
17	cast products of the Administration as described in
18	subsection (a)(1).
19	(2) To provide advice to the Federal govern-
20	ment, including Congress, as described in subsection
21	(a)(1).
22	(3) To obtain public comment on the weather
23	forecasts and products of the Administration that
24	the Administrator determines are the highest pri-
25	ority for users of such forecasts and products.

1	(d) Report.—
2	(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 2 years after
3	the date of the enactment of this Act, the Weather
4	Commission shall submit to Congress and make
5	available to the public on an Internet website a re-
6	port on matters relating to the activities of the
7	Weather Commission.
8	(2) CONTENTS.—The report submitted under
9	paragraph (1) shall include the following:
10	(A) The findings of the Weather Commis-
11	sion with respect to the assessment conducted
12	under paragraph (1) of subsection (c).
13	(B) The findings of the Weather Commis-
14	sion with respect to the public comments ob-
15	tained under paragraph (3) of such subsection
16	(C) Such recommendations as the Weather
17	Commission may have for legislative or admin-
18	istrative action.
19	(e) EXEMPTION FROM FACA.—The Weather Com-
20	mission shall not be subject to the requirements of the
21	Federal Advisory Committee Act (5 U.S.C. App.).
22	(f) TERMINATION.—The Weather Commission shall
23	terminate on the date that is 4 years after the date of
24	enactment of this Act.
