3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "Supporting Veterans
5	in STEM Careers Act".
6	SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.
7	In this Act:
8	(1) Director.—The term "Director" means
9	the Director of the National Science Foundation.
10	(2) Foundation.—The term "Foundation"

means the National Science Foundation.

1	(3) STEM.—The term "STEM" has the mean-
2	ing given the term in section 2 of the America COM-
3	PETES Reauthorization Act of 2010 (42 U.S.C.
4	6621 note).
5	(4) VETERAN.—The term "veteran" has the
6	meaning given the term in section 101 of title 38,
7	United States Code.
8	SEC. 3. SUPPORTING VETERANS IN STEM EDUCATION AND
9	COMPUTER SCIENCE.
10	(a) Supporting Veteran Involvement in Sci-
11	ENTIFIC RESEARCH AND STEM EDUCATION.—The Di-
12	rector shall, through the research and education activities
13	of the Foundation, encourage veterans to study and pur-
14	sue careers in STEM and computer science, in coordina-
15	tion with other Federal agencies that serve veterans.
16	(b) VETERAN OUTREACH PLAN.—Not later than 180
17	days after the date of enactment of this Act, the Director
18	shall submit to the Committee on Science, Space, and
19	Technology of the House of Representatives and the Com-
20	mittee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation of the
21	Senate a plan for how the Foundation can enhance its out-
22	reach efforts to veterans. Such plan shall—
23	(1) report on the Foundation's existing out-
24	reach activities;

1	(2) identify the best method for the Foundation
2	to leverage existing authorities and programs to fa-
3	cilitate and support veterans in STEM careers and
4	studies, including teaching programs; and
5	(3) include options for how the Foundation
6	could track veteran participation in research and
7	education programs of the Foundation, and describe
8	any barriers to collecting such information.
9	(c) NATIONAL SCIENCE BOARD INDICATORS RE-
10	PORT.—The National Science Board shall provide in its
11	annual report on indicators of the state of science and en-
12	gineering in the United States any available and relevant
13	data on veterans in science and engineering careers or
14	education programs.
15	(d) Robert Noyce Teacher Scholarship Pro-
16	GRAM UPDATE.—Section 10 of the National Science

20	(h) Veterans and Military Families STEM
21	EDUCATION INTERAGENCY WORKING GROUP.—
22	(1) IN GENERAL.—The Director of the Office of
23	Science and Technology Policy shall establish, or
24	designate, an interagency working group to improve

1	veteran and military spouse equity and representa-
2	tion in STEM fields.
3	(2) DUTIES OF INTERAGENCY WORKING
4	GROUP.—An interagency working group established
5	under paragraph (1) shall develop and facilitate the
6	implementation by participating agencies of a stra-
7	tegic plan, which shall—
8	(A) specify and prioritize short- and long-
9	term objectives;
10	(B) specify the common metrics that will
11	be used by Federal agencies to assess progress
12	toward achieving such objectives;
13	(C) identify barriers veterans face in reen-
14	tering the workforce, including a lack of formal
15	STEM education, career guidance, and the
16	process of transferring military credits and
17	skills to college credits;
18	(D) identify barriers military spouses face
19	in establishing careers in STEM fields;
20	(E) describe the approaches that each par-
21	ticipating agency will take to address adminis-
22	tratively the barriers described in subpara-
23	graphs (C) and (D); and

1	(F) identify any barriers that require Fed-
2	eral or State legislative or regulatory changes in
3	order to be addressed.
4	(3) Report.—The Director of the Office of
5	Science and Technology Policy shall—
6	(A) not later than 1 year after the date of
7	enactment of this Act, submit to Congress the
8	strategic plan required under paragraph (2):
9	and
10	(B) include in the annual report required
11	by section 101(d) of the America COMPETES
12	Reauthorization Act of 2010 (42 U.S.C.
13	6621(d)) a description of any progress made in
14	carrying out the activities described in para-
15	graph (2) of this subsection.
16	(4) Sunset.—An interagency working group
17	established under paragraph (1) shall terminate on
18	the date that is 5 years after the date that it is es-
