Given the current mission, major programs, and major operational objectives of the department/agency to which you have been nominated, what in your background or employment experience do you believe affirmatively qualifies you for appointment to the position for which you have been nominated, and why do you wish to serve in that position?

It has been a privilege to serve as Chairwoman of the Federal Trade Commission since 2013 and as a Commissioner since 2010 helping to further the FTC's dual mission to protect American consumers and promote

competition. The importance of the FTC's work is only increasing, and it would be an honor to continue serving on the Commission and working to ensure that consumers are free from fraudulent, deceptive, and unfair business practices and that competition is robust.

During my tenure at the FTC, and particularly in my current role as Chairwoman, I have worked closely with my fellow Commissioners and the senior leadership of the agency to ensure that our enforcement, advocacy, research, and education efforts serve to protect and advance the interests of consumers and help ensure a competitive and level playing field for businesses. As a result of my time at the Commission and my prior experience as a private practitioner, I have developed extensive expertise in antitrust, intellectual property, and consumer protection law and policy. This expertise, as well my background as a longtime litigator, has been valuable in helping ensure that the FTC continues its rigorous enforcement of consumer protection and competition laws.

Indeed, I have long understood the critical importance of protecting consumer rights, dating back to my many years of work with a non-profit legal services agency serving low-income residents of Los Angeles. While at the FTC, I have been particularly focused on helping to protect those consumers who may be especially susceptible to fraudulent and deceptive practices.

I have also devoted considerable time and attention to fostering a constructive and effective working relationship with my fellow Commissioners, continuing a tradition of bipartisan consensus in connection with the vast majority of the FTC's enforcement and policy work. The same was true during the time that I served on the Board of Commissioners for the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power. Working with my fellow Commissioners and the talented and dedicated staff of the FTC has been a highlight of my career.

19. What do you believe are your responsibilities, if confirmed, to ensure that the department/agency has proper management and accounting controls, and what experience do you have in managing a large organization?

The Chair of the Federal Trade Commission is the administrative head of the agency, and I have been serving in this capacity since 2013. The Commission has approximately 1200 employees in Washington, D.C. and

regional offices around the country and an annual budget of approximately \$300 million. As Chairwoman, it is my responsibility to ensure that agency resources are deployed efficiently and effectively, and in a manner that is consistent with the agency's mission to protect consumers and promote competition. This includes ensuring that the agency has proper management and accounting controls and evaluating, monitoring, and reporting on the effectiveness of those controls. If re-confirmed as a Commissioner, I would work closely with my fellow Commissioners and senior agency leadership to continue to review and assess the agency's internal control programs and verify that the systems and processes that are in place comply with all applicable laws and regulations.

20. What do you believe to be the top three challenges facing the department/agency, and why?

The core challenge facing the Federal Trade Commission is the task of fulfilling its broad dual mission to protect consumers and promote competition with limited resources. More substantively, the FTC is confronted every day with the challenge of keeping pace with an evolving marketplace, an increasingly diverse population of consumers, and the impact of globalization.

To be effective, the agency has had to adapt to better understand and oversee dynamic markets, changing business practices, and the increasing role of technology in consumers' lives. Although the FTC is first and foremost a civil law enforcement agency, ongoing research and engagement with stakeholders through workshops and other forums are key to ensuring that the agency stays abreast of market developments and their impact on consumers. The years of study and focus the FTC has placed on maintaining competition in healthcare markets is but one example of the ways the Commission has refined its work over time in response to changing markets. Another key example is the commitment the Commission has made to ensuring that consumers are protected to the same extent in the online and mobile arenas as they are in the brick-and-mortar world.

As the nation's consumer protection agency, it is also vital that the FTC take changing demographics into account in its enforcement, education, and outreach work. The FTC's enforcement experience and research shows that fraud impacts certain communities – the elderly, low-income consumers, military families, and ethnic minorities – differently. Adapting the way that

the FTC approaches enforcement and the way we reach out to consumers to educate them about their rights in today's complex commercial landscape is already a priority, but it will continue to be an ongoing challenge.

Increasing internationalization is yet another challenge for the agency. Today, for example, it is routine for our merger review work to involve transactions implicating multiple jurisdictions and their respective competition authorities. Similarly, many of our consumer protection cases involve unlawful conduct originating outside of the United States and require cooperation with counterpart law enforcers around the world. The FTC's role as the chief enforcer in the areas of privacy and data security also means that we must engage closely with international data protection authorities and policymakers. The FTC is a global leader in all of these areas, working to promote international convergence and best practices. Continued progress will require an ongoing commitment to, and investment in, the agency's international work.

As Chairwoman, I have made it a priority not only to seek to address these issues in our current work, but also to place the FTC on a path that will enable the agency to continue to meet these challenges in the coming years.




