5	(a) Review.—	
6	(1) IN GENERA	L.—The Commandant, in con-
7	sultation with the	Administrator of the Drug En-
8	forcement Administ	cration and the Secretary of
9	Health and Human	Services, shall—
10	(A) conduc	t a review of—

I	(1) the equipment, testing kits, and
2	rescue medications used to conduct Coast
3	Guard drug interdiction operations; and
4	(ii) the safety and training standards,
5	policies, and procedures with respect to
6	such operations; and
7	(B) determine whether the Coast Guard is
8	using the latest equipment and technology and
9	up-to-date training and standards for recog-
10	nizing, handling, testing, and securing illegal
11	drugs, fentanyl, synthetic opioids, and precursor
12	chemicals during such operations.
13	(2) Report.—Not later than 180 days after
14	the date of the enactment of this Act, the Com-
15	mandant shall submit to the appropriate committees
16	of Congress a report on the results of the review
17	conducted under paragraph (1).
18	(3) Appropriate committees of congress
19	DEFINED.—In this subsection, the term "appro-
20	priate committees of Congress" means—
21	(A) the Committee on Commerce, Science,
22	and Transportation and the Committee on Ap-
23	propriations of the Senate; and

1	(B) the Committee on Transportation and
2	Infrastructure and the Committee on Appro-
3	priations of the House of Representatives.
4	(b) REQUIREMENT.—If, as a result of the review re-
5	quired by subsection (a), the Commandant determines
6	that the Coast Guard is not using the latest equipment
7	and technology and up-to-date training and standards for
8	recognizing, handling, testing, and securing illegal drugs,
9	fentanyl, synthetic opioids, and precursor chemicals dur-
0	ing drug interdiction operations, the Commandant shall
1	ensure that the Coast Guard acquires and uses such
12	equipment and technology, carries out such training, and
13	implements such standards.
14	(c) Testing for Fentanyl.—The Commandant
15	shall ensure that Coast Guard drug interdiction operations
16	include the testing of substances encountered during such
17	operations for fentanyl, as appropriate.
