Captain Mike Ryan, a native of Norfolk, Virginia, is a 1988 graduate of the United States Coast Guard Academy, where he earned a Bachelor of Science Degree with Honors in Mathematical and Computer Sciences. He also completed a Master of Science degree in Computer Science at Purdue University in West Lafayette, Indiana in 1993.

Captain Ryan commenced service as the Executive Assistant to the 25th Commandant of the Coast Guard in March 2015. In that capacity, he harmonizes efforts to align the 88,000 member, \$10B enterprise with Commandant direction.
