3	(a) In General.—Not later than 18 months after	
4	the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of

6	ferred to in this section as the "Secretary") shall, con-	
7	sistent with the ongoing Integrated Multi-Domain Enter-	
8	prise joint effort by the Department of Homeland Security

- 11 (c) REQUIREMENTS.—The repository established
- 12 under subsection (a) shall be sufficient for the secure shar-
- 13 ing of data, information, and surveillance necessary for
- 14 operational missions, including data from governmental
- 15 assets, irrespective of whether an asset belongs to the
- 16 Coast Guard, U.S. Customs and Border Protection, or any
- 17 other partner agency, located in and around mission oper-
- 18 ation areas.
- 19 (d) ELEMENTS.—The Commissioner of U.S. Customs
- 20 and Border Protection and the Commandant shall joint-

13	(e) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in this sec-
14	tion may be construed to authorize the Coast Guard, U.S.
15	Customers and Border Protection, or any other partner
16	agency to acquire, share, or transfer personal information
17	relating to an individual in violation of any Federal or
18	State law or regulation.
