13	(b) AUTHORITY FOR ADVANCE PROCUREMENT.—The
14	Secretary is authorized to enter into one or more contracts
15	for advance procurement associated with the activities de-
16	scribed in subsection (a), including procurement of sys-
17	tems and equipment.
18	(e) Interagency Financing.—The Secretary is au-
19	thorized to participate in interagency financing, including

POLAR ICEBREAKER RECAPITALIZATION PLAN. 4 (a) REQUIREMENT.—Not later than 120 days after 5 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary, in consultation with the Secretary of the Navy, shall submit 7 to the appropriate committees of Congress, a detailed recapitalization plan to meet the 2013 Department of Homeland Security Mission Need Statement. 10 (b) CONTENTS.—The plan required by subsection (a) shall--11 12 (1) detail the number of heavy and medium 13 polar icebreakers required to meet Coast Guard stat-14 utory missions in the polar regions; 15 (2) identify the vessel specifications, capabili-16 ties, systems, equipment, and other details required 17 for the design of heavy polar icebreakers capable of 18 fulfilling the mission requirements of the Coast Guard and the Navy, and the requirements of other 19 agencies and department of the United States, as 20 21 the Secretary determines appropriate: 22 (3) list the specific appropriations required for 23 the acquisition of each icebreaker, for each fiscal 24 year, until the full fleet is recapitalized;

1	(4) describe the potential savings of serial ac-
2	quisition for new polar class icebreakers, including
3	specific schedule and acquisition requirements need-

5	(5) describe any polar icebreaking capacity gaps
6	that may arise based on the current fleet and cur-

11	SEC05. GAO REPORT ICEBREAKING CAPABILITY IN THE
12	UNITED STATES.
13	(a) REQUIREMENT.—Not later than 6 months after
14	the date of the enactment of this Act, the Comptroller
15	General of the United States shall submit to the appro-
16	priate committees of Congress a report on the current
17	state of the United States Federal polar icebreaking fleet.
18	(b) Contents.—The report required by subsection
19	(a) shall include—
20	(1) an analysis of the icebreaking assets in op-
21	eration in the United States and a description of the
22	missions completed by such assets;
23	(2) an analysis of how such assets and the ca-
24	pabilities of such assets are consistent, or incon-
25	sistent, with the polar icebreaking mission require-

ments described in the 2013 Department of Homeland Security Mission Need Statement, the Naval Operations Concept 2010, or other military and eivilian governmental missions in the United States; (3) an analysis of the gaps in icebreaking capability of the United States based on the expected service life of the fleet of United States icebreaking assets: (4) a list of countries that are allies of the United States that have the icebreaking capacity to exercise missions in the Arctic during any identified gap in United States icebreaking capacity in a polar region; and (5) a description of the policy, financial, and other barriers that have prevented timely recapitalization of the Coast Guard polar icebreaking fleet and recommendations to overcome such barriers, including potential international fee-based models used to compensate governments for icebreaking escorts

or maintenance of maritime routes.
