## A BILL

- To amend title 46 to establish a grant program for developing, offering, or improving educational or career training programs for American workers related to the maritime workforce.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

## **3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Maritime Techno-
- 5 logical Advancement Act of 2021".

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1	SEC. 2. CENTERS OF EXCELLENCE FOR DOMESTIC MARI-
2	TIME WORKFORCE.
3	Section 51706 of title 46, United States Code, is
4	amended—
5	(1) in subsection (a), by striking "of Transpor-
6	tation";
7	(2) in subsection (b), in the subsection heading,
8	by striking "ASSISTANCE" and inserting "COOPERA-
9	TIVE AGREEMENTS";
10	(3) by redesignating subsection (c) as sub-
11	section (d);
12	(4) in subsection (d), as redesignated by para-
13	graph (2), by adding at the end the following:
14	"(3) SECRETARY.—The term 'Secretary' means
15	the Secretary of Transportation."; and
16	(5) by inserting after subsection (b) the fol-
17	lowing:
18	"(c) GRANT PROGRAM.—
19	"(1) DEFINITIONS.—In this subsection:
20	"(A) ADMINISTRATOR.—The term 'Admin-
21	istrator' means the Administrator of the Mari-
22	time Administration.
23	"(B) ELIGIBLE INSTITUTION.—The term
24	'eligible institution' means a postsecondary edu-
25	cational institution (as such term is defined in
26	section 3 of the Carl D. Perkins Career and

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Technical Education Act of 2006 (20 U.S.C. 2302)) that offers a 2-year program of study, a 1-year program of training, or is a postsecondary vocational institution, and that offers educational or career training programs for American workers in the United States maritime industry.

"(C) UNITED STATES MARITIME INDUS-8 TRY.—The term 'United States maritime indus-9 try' means all segments of the maritime-related 10 transportation system of the United States, 11 both in domestic and foreign trade, and in 12 coastal, offshore, and inland waters, as well as 13 non-commercial maritime activities, such as 14 pleasure boating and marine sciences (including 15 all scientific research vessels), and all of the in-16 dustries that support such uses, including vessel 17 construction and repair, vessel operations, ship 18 logistics supply, berthing, port operations, port 19 intermodal operations, marine terminal oper-20 ations, vessel design, marine brokerage, marine 21 insurance, marine financing, chartering, mari-22 time-oriented supply chain operations, offshore 23 industry, and maritime-oriented research and 24 development. 25

1	"(2) GRANT AUTHORIZATION.—
2	"(A) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year
3	after the date of enactment of the Maritime
4	Technological Advancement Act of 2021, the
5	Administrator may award maritime career
6	training grants to eligible institutions for the
7	purpose of developing, offering, or improving
8	educational or career training programs for
9	American workers related to the maritime work-
10	force.
11	"(B) GUIDELINES.—Not later than 1 year
12	after the date of enactment of the Maritime
13	Technological Advancement Act of 2021, the
14	Administrator shall—
15	"(i) promulgate guidelines for the
16	submission of grant proposals under this
17	subsection; and
18	"(ii) publish and maintain such guide-
19	lines on the website of the Maritime Ad-
20	ministration.
21	"(3) LIMITATIONS.—The Administrator may
22	not award a grant under this subsection in an
23	amount that is more than \$20,000,000.
24	"(4) REQUIRED INFORMATION.—

1	"(A) IN GENERAL.—An eligible institution
2	that desires to receive a grant under this sub-
3	section shall submit to the Administrator a
4	grant proposal that includes a detailed descrip-
5	tion of—
6	"(i) the specific project for which the
7	grant proposal is submitted, including the
8	manner in which the grant will be used to
9	develop, offer, or improve an educational
10	or career training program that is suited
11	to maritime industry workers;
12	"(ii) the extent to which the project
13	for which the grant proposal is submitted
14	will meet the educational or career training
15	needs of maritime workers in the commu-
16	nity served by the eligible institution;
17	"(iii) the extent to which the project
18	for which the grant proposal is submitted
19	fits within any overall strategic plan devel-
20	oped by an eligible community; and
21	"(iv) any previous experience of the
22	eligible institution in providing maritime
23	educational or career training programs.
24	"(B) COMMUNITY OUTREACH REQUIRED.—
25	In order to be considered by the Administrator,

1	a grant proposal submitted by an eligible insti-
2	tution under this subsection shall—
3	"(i) demonstrate that the eligible in-
4	stitution
5	"(I) reached out to employers to
6	identify
7	"(aa) any shortcomings in
8	existing maritime educational
9	and career training opportunities
10	available to workers in the com-
11	munity; and
12	"(bb) any future employ-
13	ment opportunities within the
14	community and the educational
15	and career training skills re-
16	quired for workers to meet the
17	future maritime employment de-
18	mand; and
19	"(II) reached out to other simi-
20	larly situated institutions in an effort
21	to benefit from any best practices that
22	may be shared with respect to pro-
23	viding maritime educational or career
24	training programs to workers eligible
25	for training; and

"(ii) include a detailed description 1 of----2 "(I) the extent and outcome of 3 the outreach conducted under clause 4 (i); 5 "(II) the extent to which the 6 project for which the grant proposal is 7 submitted will contribute to meeting 8 any shortcomings identified under 9 clause (i)(I)(aa) or any maritime edu-10 cational or career training needs iden-11 tified under clause (i)(I)(bb); and 12 "(III) the extent to which em-13 ployers, including small- and medium-14 sized firms within the community, 15 have demonstrated a commitment to 16 employing workers who would benefit 17 from the project for which the grant 18 proposal is submitted. 19 "(5) CRITERIA FOR AWARD OF GRANTS.-20 "(A) IN GENERAL.-Subject to the appro-21 priation of funds, the Administrator shall award 22 a grant under this subsection based on-23 "(i) a determination of the merits of 24 the grant proposal submitted by the eligi-25

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1	ble institution to develop, offer, or improve
2	maritime educational or career training
3	programs to be made available to workers;
4	"(ii) an evaluation of the likely em-
5	ployment opportunities available to workers
6	who complete a maritime educational or
7	career training program that the eligible
8	institution proposes to develop, offer, or
9	improve;
10	"(iii) an evaluation of prior demand
11	for training programs by workers in the
12	community served by the eligible institu-
13	tion, as well as the availability and capac-
14	ity of existing maritime training programs
15	to meet future demand for training pro-
16	grams;
17	"(iv) any prior designation of an insti-
18	tution as a Center of Excellence for Do-
19	mestic Maritime Workforce Training and
20	Education; and
21	"(v) an evaluation of the previous ex-
22	perience of the eligible institution in pro-
23	viding maritime educational or career
24	training programs.

REQUIREMENTS.—A "(B) MATCHING 1 grant awarded under this subsection may not 2 be used to satisfy any private matching require-3 ment under any other provision of law. 4 "(6) COMPETITIVE AWARDS .---5 "(A) IN GENERAL.—The Administrator 6 shall award grants under this subsection to eli-7 gible institutions on a competitive basis in ac-8 cordance with guidelines and requirements es-9 tablished by the Administrator under paragraph 10 (2)(B).11 "(B) TIMING OF GRANT NOTICE.—The Ad-12 ministrator shall post a Notice of Funding Op-13 portunity regarding grants awarded under this 14 subsection not more than 90 days after the date 15 of enactment of the appropriations Act for the 16 fiscal year concerned. 17 "(C) TIMING OF GRANTS.-The Adminis-18 trator shall award grants under this subsection 19 not later than 270 days after the date of the 20enactment of the appropriations Act for the fis-21 cal year concerned. 22 "(D) APPLICATION OF REQUIREMENTS .----23 The requirements under subparagraphs (B) and 24 (C) shall not apply until the guidelines required 25

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under paragraph (2)(B) have been promul gated.
 "(E) REUSE OF UNEXPENDED GRANT
 FUNDS.—Notwithstanding subparagraph (C),
 amounts awarded as a grant under this sub-

section that are not expended by the grantee shall remain available to the Administrator for use for grants under this subsection.

9 "(F) ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS.—Not more 10 than 3 percent of amounts made available to 11 carry out this subsection may be used for the 12 necessary costs of grant administration.

"(7) ELIGIBLE USES OF GRANT FUNDS.—An eligible institution receiving a grant under this subsection—

"(A) shall carry out activities that are
identified as priorities for the purpose of developing, offering, or improving educational or career training programs for the United States
maritime industry workforce;

"(B) shall provide training to upgrade the
skills of the United States maritime industry
workforce, including training to acquire covered
requirements as well as technical skills training

1	for jobs in the United States maritime industry;
2	and
3	"(C) may use the grant funds to
4	"(i) admit additional students to mar-
5	itime training programs;
6	"(ii) expand existing or create new
7	maritime training programs, including
8	through partnerships with 4-year institu-
9	tions of higher education or apprentice-
10	ships with the United States maritime in-
11	dustry;
12	"(iii) create new maritime career
13	pathways;
14	"(iv) expand existing or create new
15	training programs for transitioning mili-
16	tary veterans to careers in the United
17	States maritime industry;
18	"(v) purchase, construct, develop, ex-
19	pand, or improve training facilities, build-
20	ings, and equipment to deliver maritime
21	training programs;
22	"(vi) recruit and train additional fac-
23	ulty to expand the maritime training pro-
24	grams offered by the institution;

1	"(vii) provide financial assistance
2	through scholarships or tuition waivers,
3	not to exceed the applicable tuition ex-
4	penses associated with the covered pro-
5	grams;
6	"(viii) promote the use of distance
7	learning that enables students to take
8	courses through the use of teleconfer-
9	encing, the Internet, and other media tech-
10	nology;
11	"(ix) assist in providing services to
12	address maritime workforce recruitment
13	and training of youth residing in targeted
14	high-poverty areas within empowerment
15	zones and enterprise communities;
16	"(x) implement partnerships with na-
17	tional and regional organizations with spe-
18	cial expertise in developing, organizing,
19	and administering maritime workforce re-
20	cruitment and training services;
21	"(xi) design, develop, and test an
22	array of approaches to providing recruit-
23	ment, training, or retention services, to en-
24	hance diversity, equity and inclusion in the

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1	United States maritime industry work-
2	force;
3	"(xii) in conjunction with employers,
4	organized labor, other groups (such as
5	community coalitions), and Federal, State,
6	or local agencies, design, develop, and test
7	various training approaches in order to de-
8	termine effective practices; or
9	"(xiii) assist in the development and
10	replication of effective service delivery
11	strategies for the United States maritime
12	industry as a whole.
13	"(8) PUBLIC REPORT.—Not later than Decem-
14	ber 15 in each of the calendar years 2023 through
15	2025, the Administrator shall make available on a
16	publicly available website a report and provide a
17	briefing to the Committee on Commerce, Science,
18	and Transportation of the Senate and the Com-
19	mittee on Transportation and Infrastructure of the
20	House of Representatives—
21	"(A) describing each grant awarded under
22	this subsection during the preceding fiscal year;
23	"(B) assessing the impact of each award of
24	a grant under this subsection in a fiscal year

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1	preceding the fiscal year referred to in subpara-
2	graph (A) on workers receiving training; and
3	"(C) the performance of the grant awarded
4	with respect to the indicators of performance
5	under section 116(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Workforce
6	Innovation and Opportunity Act (29 U.S.C.
7	3141(b)(2)(A)(i)).
8	"(9) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—
9	There is authorized to be appropriated to carry out
10	this subsection \$40,000,000 for each of the fiscal
11	years 2022 through 2026.".
