OCCUPANTS IN VEHICLE CRASHES.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after the 5 date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall revise 6 the crash investigation data collection system of the Na-7 tional Highway Traffic Safety Administration to include 8 the collection of the following data in connection with vehi-9 cle crashes whenever a child restraint system was in use 10 in a vehicle involved in a crash:

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(1) The type or types of child restraint systems
in use during the crash in any vehicle involved in the
crash, including whether a five-point harness or belt positioning booster.

5 (2) If a five-point harness child restraint system 6 was in use during the crash, whether the child re-7 straint system was forward-facing or rear-facing in 8 the vehicle concerned.

9 (b) CONSULTATION.—In implementing subsection 10 (a), the Secretary shall work with law enforcement offi-11 cials, safety advocates, the medical community, and re-12 search organizations to improve the recordation of data 13 described in subsection (a) in police and other applicable 14 incident reports.

15 (c) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the date 16 of enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation 17 of the Senate and the Committee on Energy and Com-18 merce of the House of Representatives a report on child 19 occupant crash data collection in the crash investigation 20 data collection system of the National Highway Traffic 21 Safety Administration pursuant to the revision required 22 23 by subsection (a).
