 7 of enactment of this Act, the Federal Trade Commission
 8 (in this section referred to as the “Commission”) shall
 9 submit to the Committee on Commerce, Science, and
 10 Transportation of the Senate and the Committee on En-

1 ergy and Commerce of the House of Representatives a re-
2 port regarding the enforcement actions of the Commission
3 against prohibited market manipulation or false informa-
4 tion under section 813 of the Energy Independence and
5 Security Act of 2007 (42 U.S.C. 17303) during the cal-
6 endar year commencing on January 1, 2022, and the pre-
7 ceding 5 calendar years.

8 (b) REPORT CONTENTS.—The report required under

19 per enforcement action;

20 (ii) the average civil penalty assessed
21 in each enforcement action; and

22 (iii) the aggregate civil penalties col-
23 lected by the Commission during the cal-
24 endar year; and

2 sulted in a finding of no violation of such sec-
3 tion 811 or 812.
