I believe many aspects of my background make me qualified to serve as the Deputy Administrator of NASA, and it would be an immense honor to do so. First and foremost, I grew up moving around the globe as my father served our nation as an Air Force chaplain and my mom was a schoolteacher. Due to my family's military service, I attended three high schools in four years. I learned very early on the value, and the challenges, of serving our nation.

My competitive nature stems from years of playing competitive sports. As a four-year, NCAA Division I All-Conference soccer player at the US Air Force Academy, I learned the value of hard work and personal sacrifice for team glory. And how to fail...and move on. I've applied these lessons-learned throughout my professional career from flying jets in combat to the corporate board room. If confirmed, I will again lean on these principles at NASA as our nation competes against our geopolitical rivals.

My educational background, 24+ years of experience as a senior officer and pilot in the US Air Force, and experience working with the government as a partner in the aerospace sector reflect my life-long passion of aviation, space and service to our nation.

As a student, I earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Biology from the US Air Force Academy, a Master of Science degree in Aeronautical Science from Embry Riddle Aeronautical University, and a Master of Art degree in Leadership and Counseling from the University of Colorado-Colorado Springs. These three degrees provide me a solid academic foundation that uniquely tie the core functions related to the NASA Deputy Administrator role.

As a retired Air Force pilot, I have nearly 5,000 flight hours in five different aircraft...including 650 combat hours and four Air Medals. I've had the honor of commanding America's finest Airmen in combat and commanded the Department of Defense's only nuclear airlift squadron. In this capacity, I was charged with personally flying, as well as leading the crews that safely transport the nation's nuclear weapons around the world. Similar to NASA human spaceflight missions, nuclear weapon airlifts missions are "no fail" and have White House attention, every time.

While in uniform, I was selected to work directly for three different 4-star Generals/Admirals, in three different military services: Admiral Sandy Winnefeld (US Navy), General Tod Wolters (US Air Force) and General Chuck Jacoby (US Army). No doubt, while working for the nation's highest ranking military members, I learned the importance of civil-military relations and the crucial role of the legislative branch of the US government.

Shortly after the establishment of the US Space Force in December of 2019, I was the very first volunteer to help stand up the Space Force Association (SFA)...the only national, private non-profit organization to solely support the Space Force and its Guardians. Since inception, I've served as the Director of Outreach, Chief Operating Officer, and currently serve as SFA's Chief Growth Officer.

After retiring from the Air Force in 2021, I've served as Vice President, Space Force and Air Force Client Executive at CACI International (CACI). CACI is a 25,000 person, \$8.5B annual revenue, publicly traded government contracting company focused on delivering expertise and technology to

government customers. In this capacity, I maintain a Top Secret/Sensitive Compartmented Information (TS/SCI) security clearance.

My family has always made big decisions together. I know and recognize that they are the **real** force-multiplier that helps make me qualified for this role. Therefore, I'm very thankful and want to acknowledge my wife (Christine) of nearly 25 years and two daughters, Kayla (21) and Lauren (19), who continue to support me personally and professionally. They selflessly served our nation by my side for decades, and I'm extremely appreciative of their continued support as we pursue this new opportunity at NASA as a team.

Christine serves special needs children as a Speech Language Pathologist in a local elementary school in Colorado Springs. She grew up the daughter of an Air Force officer and is the most selfless human on the planet. Kayla (21) is an Air Force ROTC cadet in her senior year at the University of Notre Dame, where she served as the Air Force ROTC Detachment 225 fall Wing Commander. She will attend Air Force pilot training following her May 2026 graduation and commissioning. This fulfills a life-long dream of hers and she will soon be a third-generation Air Force officer. Lauren (19) is a freshman student athlete on the women's soccer team at the University of Chicago, where she is majoring in business economics. This fall, the lady Maroons made a historic run in the NCAA Division III tournament, earning a spot in the Final Four. Lauren continues to amaze us as she effortlessly balances the academic and athletic demands of UChicago. Christine and I couldn't be prouder of both Kayla and Lauren.

Ultimately, I hope to have the opportunity to advance the President's goal for America to lead in space, science, technology, and exploration as Deputy NASA Administrator.

It is imperative that the Deputy Administrator of NASA manages the agency responsibly and efficiently to ensure its organizational resources are dedicated to consistently moving the ball forward and advancing our national interests.

If confirmed as the Deputy Administrator for NASA, I believe my responsibilities will be to support the Administrator's priorities and leverage the talent and experience within NASA to ensure proper management and controls.

My 24-year career as an Air Force officer provided me multiple leadership opportunities as a commander and senior staff officer—all experiences that I will leverage to lead NASA.

More recently, my executive experience at CACI International and the Space Force Association has provided me the experience to lead both large, publicly traded companies as well as a new, private non-profit organization with proper governance and accounting controls.

If confirmed as the Deputy Administrator for NASA, I will be committed to supporting the Administrator's priorities and working alongside some of the nation's best and brightest to ensure NASA remains the world leader in space exploration and scientific discovery.

1. **Distracting priorities:** Despite decades of ambition, NASA has yet to return humans to the Moon or establish a viable plan for Mars. Streamlining objectives will accelerate progress toward these transformative goals.
2. **Program Execution:** NASA's flagship missions are consistently delayed and over budget, slowing the rate of groundbreaking discoveries. This is due to complex internal processes and a need for stronger project management.
3. **Bureaucratic barriers:** For too long, the space economy has been limited to traditional government customers. To drive growth and stay ahead of our adversaries, we must reduce bureaucratic barriers and strengthen partnerships.





