3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Safe Cribs Act".

5 SEC. 2. BANNING OF CRIB BUMPERS.

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the
7 date of enactment of this Act, crib bumpers, regardless
8 of the date of manufacture, shall be considered a banned

hazardous product under section 8 of the Consumer Prod uct Safety Act (15 U.S.C. 2057).

3 (b) CRIB BUMPER DEFINED.—In this section, the
4 term "crib bumper"—

5 (1) means any material that is intended to 6 cover the sides of a crib to prevent injury to any crib 7 occupant from impacts against the side of a crib or 8 to prevent partial or complete access to any openings 9 in the sides of a crib to prevent a crib occupant from 10 getting any part of the body entrapped in any open-11 ing;

12 (2) includes a padded crib bumper, a supported
13 and unsupported vinyl bumper guard, and vertical
14 crib slat covers; and

15 (3) does not include a non-padded mesh crib16 liner.
