1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE; FINDINGS.

- 4 (a) SHORT TITLE.—This Act may be cited as the
- 5 "Expanding Findings for Federal Opioid Research and
- 6 Treatment Act" or the "EFFORT Act".
- 7 (b) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that—
- 8 (1) research gaps exist in the prevention and9 treatment of opioid addiction;

(2) the National Science Foundation's research 1 on opioid addiction has increased understanding of 2 the neuroscience of addiction, substance abuse inter-3 vention, the role of illicit supply networks, the sec-4 ondary effects on families, the use of technology to 5 address the opioid epidemic, and options for alter-6 native, non-addictive therapeutics for pain; and 7 8 (3) the National Science Foundation and the National Institutes of Health have recognized that 9 clinical. 10 questions in basic, and fundamental translational research would benefit greatly from 11 12 multidisciplinary approaches and collaboration. SEC. 2. NSF SUPPORT OF RESEARCH ON OPIOID ADDIC-13 14 TION. (a) IN GENERAL.-The Director of the National 15 Science Foundation, in consultation with the Director of 16 the National Institutes of Health, shall support merit-re-17 viewed and competitively-awarded research on the science 18 19 of opioid addiction. (b) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.-To carry 20out this section, there are authorized to be appropriated 21\$10,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2020 through 2024. 22
