4 (a) REQUIREMENT BEFORE IMPLEMENTING NEW 5 RULES.—

6 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary may not 7 amend, adjust, or revise the driver hours of service 8 regulations for motor carriers of passengers, by rule-9 making or any other means, until the Secretary con-10 ducts a formal study that properly accounts for 11 operational differences and variances in crash data $\mathbf{2}$

1	for drivers in intercity motorcoach service and inter-
2	state property carrier operations and between seg-
3	ments of the intercity motorcoach industry.
4	(2) CONTENTS.—The study required under
5	paragraph (1) shall include—
6	(A) the impact of the current hours of
7	service regulations for motor carriers of pas-
8	sengers on fostering safe operation of intercity
9	motorcoaches;
10	(B) the separation of the failures of the
11	current passenger carrier hours-of-service regu-
12	lations and the lack of enforcement of the cur-
13	rent regulations by Federal and State agencies;
14	(C) the correlation of noncompliance with
15	current passenger carrier hours of service rule
16	to passenger carrier accidents using data from
17	2000 through 2013; and
18	(D) how passenger carrier crashes could
19	have been mitigated by any changes to pas-
20	senger carrier hours of service rules.
21	(b) EMERGENCY REGULATIONS.—Nothing in this
22	section may be construed to affect the Secretary's existing
23	authority to provide relief from the hours of service regula-
