Given the current mission, major programs, and major operational objectives of the Coast Guard, what in your background or employment experience do you believe affirmatively qualifies you for appointment to the position for which you have been nominated, and why do you wish to serve in that position?

I believe that I am affirmatively qualified for appointment to a position of importance and responsibility in the grade of Vice Admiral (O-9) per 14 U.S.C. Section 305 based on a strong record of leading women and men to conduct operations across all Coast Guard mission sets. I have also

demonstrated successful senior leadership skills and the ability to work with joint and interagency partners from federal, tribal, state, and local governments, the private sector, and with allies and other foreign governments. My most recent experience commanding the Coast Guard's forces in Atlantic Area showcased my ability to oversee complex operations under dynamic and challenging environmental conditions, including evolving threats and fiscal constraints.

I wish to serve in the position of importance and responsibility in the grade of Vice Admiral (O-9) per 14 U.S.C Section 305 because I have a strong commitment to our people and the missions of the Coast Guard. I believe that I can continue to make lasting contributions to the betterment of the organization at the highest levels. I am honored to have been selected for nomination and am dedicated to continuing to serve at the executive level.

23. What do you believe are your responsibilities, if confirmed, to ensure that the Coast Guard has proper management and accounting controls, and what experience do you have in managing a large organization?

Proper controls and management of business processes are critical to the Coast Guard maintaining the public trust that we have earned over decades of faithful service. In one of my previous assignments as Chief of Naval Engineering of the Coast Guard, I was responsible for all ship maintenance and repair including our only organic shipyard, the Coast Guard Yard in Baltimore, Maryland. This extensive enterprise of over 2,500 workers completed hundreds of millions of dollars of maintenance and repair contracts and included inventory control points with over \$150 million in inventory. My experience running that large organization, including the contracting and inventorying functions, provided me invaluable experience for positions of even greater responsibility. As an engineer and process driven thinker, I clearly understand that proper management and accounting controls are essential to efficient operations and will work to ensure they are maintained in the Coast Guard.

24. What do you believe to be the top three challenges facing the Coast Guard, and why?

The Coast Guard's top three challenges include: modernizing our fleet and infrastructure; securing the maritime border and approaches; and, recruiting and retaining talent. A comprehensive plan, such as Force Design 2028, that

reframes how the Coast Guard acquires and maintains its assets, is the key to securing the resources, assets, and authorities the Service needs to effectively meet the needs of our Nation. Controlling the border, protecting the marine transportation system, countering transnational organized crime, exerting sovereignty and ensuring national defense during the coming years will become even more challenging. How does the Coast Guard prepare to perform our statutory missions in the future? Are we adequately prepared with the ongoing recapitalization of our fleet of ships and aircraft?

Transformational change, such as Force Design 2028, that integrates program capabilities and streamlines procurement and acquisitions will ensure the Coast Guard is poised to take advantage of the large investments in capital assets and shore infrastructure needed to ensure that the Coast Guard is ready to meet the challenges of the future.

We must strengthen our commitment to border security, territorial, integrity, and sovereignty in the maritime domain. Illegal immigration is a national security issue, and the Coast Guard is the Nation's premier agency for law enforcement and protection of the maritime approaches. A prime example is the southeast border of the United States where we protect, defend, and secure the borders of Florida and Puerto Rico from illegal maritime migration and illicit activity. The Coast Guard must continue to focus on control of the maritime border and approaches, including protection of our ports and waterways.

The need to attract and retain young women and men to serve in the Coast Guard is a pressing challenge facing us today. We must grow the Coast Guard to meet the mission demand and that will take increased emphasis on recruiting and retention efforts. Taking these actions and overhauling our human resources system starts now and requires innovative thinking and decisive action.

Vice Admiral Moore assumed the duties as Commander, Atlantic Area in May 2024 where he is responsible for directing Coast Guard forces and operations across all mission areas in five Districts from the Navigable Inland Waterways east of the Rocky Mountains to the Great Lakes, Gulf Coast, and East Coast of the United States throughout the Atlantic Ocean and adjacent parts of the Arctic Ocean to the Arabian Gulf. He also serves as Commander, Coast Guard Defense Force East, providing Coast Guard support as part of the joint force to the Department of Defense and Combatant Commanders for national defense missions. He is also appointed and serves as the Director, Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Joint Task Force East, responsible for coordinating and synchronizing DHS cross-component operations to address threats to the southeast U.S. border and approaches.



Vice Admiral Moore previously served as the Deputy Commander, Atlantic Area. Other flag assignments include serving as Commander, 17th Coast Guard District where he was responsible for Coast Guard operations throughout Alaska, the North Pacific Ocean, the Arctic Ocean, and the Bering Sea. He served as the Assistant Commandant for Engineering and Logistics (CG-4), responsible for all naval, aeronautical, civil, and industrial engineering and logistics for the Service.

Additionally, VADM Moore served as the Deputy Commander Pacific Area where he was responsible for all Coast Guard mission from the Rocky Mountains west to the eastern coast of Africa.

As a cutterman, Vice Admiral Moore served as a Student Engineer aboard USCGC Polar Star (WAGB 10), Engineer Officer aboard USCGC Harriet Lane (WMEC 903), Executive Officer of USCGC Venturous (WMEC 625), Commanding Officer aboard USCGC Resolute (WMEC 620), and most recently Commanding Officer of USCGC Stratton (WMSL 752).

Previous staff assignments include: Chief of Staff of U.S. Coast Guard Pacific Area, Chief of the Office of Naval Engineering at Coast Guard Headquarters (CG-45), Chief of the Officer Assignment Branch (OPM-2) at Personnel Services Center, Commanding Officer of Naval Engineering Support Unit Honolulu, and ship stability instructor at the Navy Surface Warfare Officer School in Newport, Rhode Island.

Vice Admiral Moore graduated from the United States Coast Guard Academy with a Bachelor of Science degree in Naval Architecture and Marine Engineering in 1992. He holds both a Masters of Naval Architecture and Marine Engineering and a Master of Business Administration from the University of Michigan and Masters of National Resource Strategy from the Eisenhower School. His military decorations include five Legions of Merit, five Meritorious Service Medals, two Coast Guard Commendation Medals, and the Navy Commendation Medal. He has been a registered Professional Engineer in the state of Michigan since 1999.
