Given the current mission, major programs, and major operational objectives of the Coast Guard, what in your background or employment experience do you believe affirmatively qualifies you for appointment to the position for which you have been nominated, and why do you wish to serve in that position?

If confirmed, it will be an honor to continue to serve our great nation in the United States Coast Guard. I have a wide breadth of experience in Coast

Guard operations, with expertise in nine of the eleven statutory missions and eight of the nine districts. My diverse background on both the active duty and reserve force provides an additional unique perspective on the broad needs of our service's workforce. I have led personnel at all levels of command, from small operational units, Area Commands, and joint Combatant Commands to interagency emergency response contingencies, most recently as Deputy Pacific Area Commander. Additionally, I have taught and liaised with international and interagency partners around the globe on a wide variety of assignments to include Task Force Arctic Commander. Throughout all these opportunities, it has been apparent to me that it is our dedicated responders who carry out the critical duties of the Coast Guard. As such, I am committed to ensuring they have the tools necessary to complete assigned missions in support of national security.

23. What do you believe are your responsibilities, if confirmed, to ensure that the Coast Guard has proper management and accounting controls, and what experience do you have in managing a large organization?

It is every Coast Guard Service member's responsibility to uphold the Coast Guard core values of honor, respect, and devotion to duty. If confirmed, it is my duty to ensure proper fiscal management and accounting of Coast Guard funds placed within my charge. In accordance with applicable laws and regulations, I will be an honest and fiscally prudent steward with resources and funds under my management. I recently served as Incident Commander for Operation Vigilant Sentry- the 2024-2025 response to mass maritime migration in the Caribbean. In that position, I ensured fiscal responsibility on all resource procurement and surged personnel as well as maintained proper distribution of the multi-million dollar budget.

24. What do you believe to be the top three challenges facing the Coast Guard, and why?

Arctic Security- During my time as Task Force Arctic Commander, it was clear that there is increased maritime activity in the Arctic by both Allies and competitive nations. In order to strengthen deterrence, the Coast Guard must increase its cooperation with allied nations and its operational capacity in the Arctic waterways. The multi-billion dollar reconciliation funding is a much-needed investment towards new icebreakers for the region to deter incursions within the US Exclusive Economic Zone and the Extended Continental Shelf. Once operational, these new resources will ensure protection of US

sovereignty as well as defense of the northern US border and Arctic maritime approaches. Additionally, continued support from Congress will ensure the aging Arctic fleet can remain operational as demonstrated by the maiden patrol of CGC STORIS in the summer of 2025. During that patrol, CGC STORIS made an immediate and lasting impact against competitive nations.

Personnel- Similar to all the Military Services, the Coast Guard is facing personnel and recruiting challenges. While the Coast Guard met its recruiting goals in the last year, overall personnel numbers are still below optimum levels. The Force Design goals include an additional 15,000 active duty and reserve personnel, which will require the recruitment, retention and training of those new service members. These critical functions will ensure the Coast Guard can man, train, and equip the new cutters that will shortly be operational from the \$24+ billion in reconciliation funding. As Active-Duty Coast Guard personnel transition towards the end of enlistment, if their decision is to leave active-duty service, the Coast Guard reserve must remain an attractive option for continued part-time service to the nation. As a parent of two Coast Guard junior officers and one Coast Guard Academy cadet, I am personally invested in the future success of the service and have volunteered as a Coast Guard Academy Admissions Partner for over six years. As such I have had the privilege of helping over a dozen people successfully apply for both the Academy Introductory Mission (AIM) program and a cadet appointment at the Coast Guard Academy in Connecticut.

Increased Mission Demand- The Coast Guard safeguards the nation's maritime waterways and defends the maritime borders. Over the last few years, there has been steady increased demand for the US Coast Guard both at home and abroad. Most recently, the Coast Guard has increased patrols in the Rio Grande, Southwest shallow waters and the Southeast to deter illegal immigration as well as deny illicit narcotics including fentanyl entry into our ports. Meanwhile, non-traditional surge deployments supporting critical national security needs such as upcoming America 250 and FIFA World Cup coupled with the requirement to maintain nationwide steady state missions remains high. Additionally, training and increased international partnerships have stretched current Coast Guard personnel and resources thin as we answer the call. The ability to recruit, train, and retain personnel are crucial elements to ensure service wide sustainability to answer the increased demand for Coast Guard services to the nation and around the globe.

Previously, when I was nominated for Rear Admiral (lower half) I reported that in 2015, when I was assigned as the Senior Reserve Officer (SRO) at Coast Guard Sector Columbia River, an individual with an ongoing history of disciplinary action was inadvertently transferred to the unit. As the SRO, I worked with Coast Guard Headquarters Reserve Personnel Management to transfer the reserve member back to their original unit. At this time, the individual started the EEO pre-complaint process. The matter was resolved during the pre-complaint process with a phone call between myself, the individual, and both commands.

RDML Joanna Hiigel currently serves as Deputy Commandant for Operations Senior Reserve Officer and Reserve Policy Board President. She previously served as Coast Guard Task Force-Arctic Commander, Deputy Commander, Coast Guard Pacific Area, Trident Forge Director, Operation Vigilant Sentry Incident Commander, and Deputy Commandant for Mission Support (DCMS) Senior Reserve Officer. In 2022, she served as USCG Pacific Area Senior Reserve Officer leading 1,500 Reserve Personnel. RDML Hiigel graduated from the United States Coast Guard Academy in 1995 and reported to USCGC ACTIVE in Port Angeles, WA where she served as Officer of the Deck (OOD), Weapons Officer, First Lieutenant and Boarding Officer.

In 1997, RDML Hiigel reported to Tactical Law Enforcement Team (TACLET) Gulf where she served as the Officer-In-Charge of Law Enforcement Detachment (LEDET) 8B deploying with US and Dutch Naval vessels with a follow-on tour at Group Seattle as the Assistant Operations Officer.

In 2000, RDML Hiigel transitioned into the USCG Reserve and served at Group/Air Station Port Angeles, WA, followed by Air Station Borinquen in Aguadilla, PR and Sector Mobile, AL. In 2009, RDML Hiigel transferred to Alameda, CA where she completed Active-Duty orders in support of the Deepwater Horizon oil spill response and the commissioning of USCGC STRATTON with a follow-on tour at Sector Columbia River in Astoria, OR as the Senior Reserve Officer.

In 2015, RDML Hiigel transferred to US Indo Pacific Command (US INDOPACOM) in Hawaii. She supported the annual BAKAMLA joint exercise in Indonesia, served as liaison to an Australian government official during a bilateral exercise and completed Active-Duty Incident Commander duties in support of Sector New York dielectric oil spill and Incident Management for Coast Guard District Seven following the 2017 Hurricanes Irma and Maria.

From 2017-2019, RDML Hiigel served as the District Thirteen Reserve Chief of Staff leading 350 Pacific Northwest Reserve Personnel. She deployed in support of Hurricane Lane, US INDOPACOM and US SOUTHCOM exercises, as well as WestPac missions in the Philippines.

In 2019-2021, RDML Hiigel led Coast Guard Reserve Unit, US Transportation Command as the Commanding Officer. While there, she deployed in support of global COVID-19 Response operations as well as Operation Allies Welcome.

RDML Hiigel earned a Master of Arts degree in Emergency and Disaster Management from American Military University, Bachelor of Science degree in Business Management from the United States Coast Guard Academy and is a graduate from Naval War College with Joint Professional Military Education. She earned Type 1 Incident Commander, Liaison Officer, and Type 3 Planning Section Chief Incident Management qualifications. Military decorations include the Defense Superior Service Medal, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (four awards), Coast Guard Commendation Medal (three awards), Coast Guard Achievement Medal (five awards), and Coast Guard Expert Pistol Medal.
